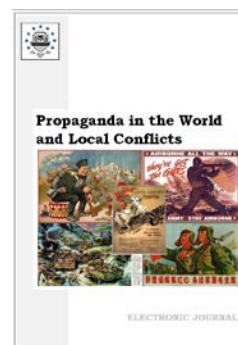

The Journal “Propaganda in the World and Local Conflicts” (2014–2024): A Thematic Review of Published Research Over the Last 10 Years

Abstract

This article is devoted to the ten-year results of the publication activity of the military-historical scientific journal “Propaganda in the World and Local Conflicts” (2014–2024). The materials for this study were the works that were published in this journal in the period from 2014 to 2024. The research methodology is presented by both general scientific and special research methods. In the article, the author analyzes in detail the thematic range of works published by the authors, and also highlights the most popular topics in the history of propaganda. In conclusion, the author notes that during the ten-year period of existence of the journal “Propaganda in the World and Local Conflicts”, 110 articles were published in it on various areas of propaganda history, including: military propaganda during the Russian Civil War (1917–1922), military propaganda of the First World War (1914–1918), general issues of military propaganda of the Second World War (1939–1945), propaganda of Nazi Germany during the Second World War (1939–1945), history and propaganda of the Russo-Japanese War (1904–1905), propaganda during the Soviet-Finnish War (1939–1940), propaganda in Southern Rhodesia during the bush war (1965–1979), and others.

1. Introduction

In nowadays journal “Propaganda in the World and Local Conflicts” is an open-access military-historical scientific publication that publishes studies devoted to various aspects of both the history of military propaganda in general and the history of the theory and practice of propaganda in particular.

The purpose of this work is to provide a thematic review of studies that were published in the journal Propaganda in the World and Local Conflicts in the period from 2014 to 2024.

This article is an attempt by the author to summarize the publication activity of the journal “Propaganda in the World and Local Conflicts” and its authors over the past 10 years (2014–2024).

2. Materials and methods

The research methodology is based on general scientific and special research methods. General scientific research methods are represented by: analysis, synthesis, induction, deduction. Special research methods are represented by: content analysis (to analyze the content of studies that were published in the journal), bibliographic method (in terms of selection, classification and

ranking of studies that were published in the journal), and narrative method (to form the narrative line of this work).

The materials for this study were studies that were published in the journal “Propaganda in the World and Local Conflicts” in the period from 2014 to 2024.

3. Discussion

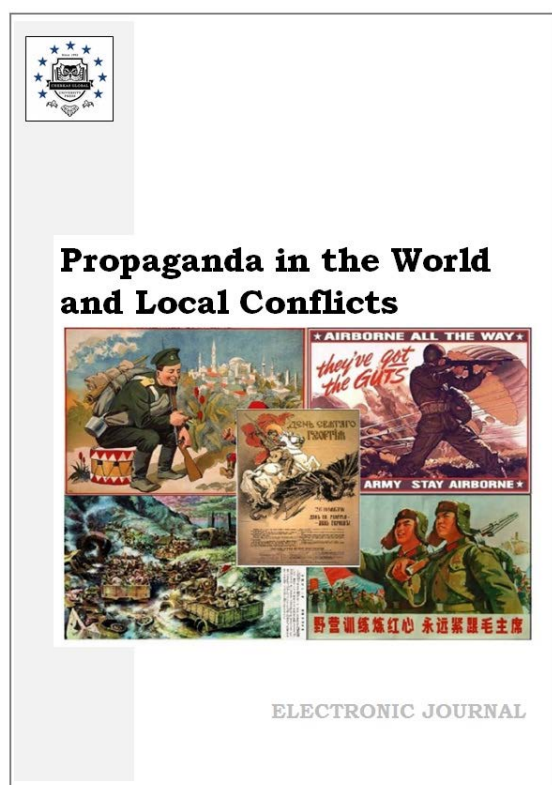


Fig. 1. Cover of the scientific military history journal Propaganda in the World and Local Conflicts.

The journal was founded in 2014 and is still being published. From 2014 to the present, the journal is published twice a year (the first issue in June and the second issue in December) (Figure 1).

The journal's mission is to present the results of current research on the role of propaganda in terms of local or global military conflict. The importance is given to the history theory and practice of propaganda activities. The special attention is paid to the advocacy in local conflicts in distant parts of the world.

The journal's objective is to familiarize the scientific community with research results and their interpretation relating to topical issues of propaganda in the context of the global or local conflict. The Editorial Board is interested in the formation of international scientific cooperation, enhancing the scientific ethics and publication activity of researchers in this field of scientific interests.

Over the ten-year period of its existence, the journal has repeatedly become the object of research in works devoted to the study of the history of military propaganda. As one of the most striking examples of such work, we can note the study of a group of authors from the Peoples' Friendship University of Russia, which was devoted to the study of the topic of military propaganda during the First World War on the pages of the journal (Bulgarova et al., 2022).

Thus, the journal “Propaganda in the World and Local Conflicts” plays an important role in the study of war propaganda, the preservation of historical memory, the increasing dissemination of knowledge about such a narrow field of historical science, and also contains a sufficiently high research potential (Shtuts i dr., 2023) for future research.

4. Results

The topic of history and propaganda of the Russian-Japanese War (1904–1905) was studied by M.M. Kirilov (Kirilov, 2020) and A.M. Mamadaliev (Mamadaliev, 2020). The topic of propaganda activities of socialists in 1905 was studied by K.V. Taran (Taran, 2015).

Various aspects of the history and propaganda topics during the World War I (1914–1918) are presented in the works of A.A. Cherkasov (Cherkasov et al., 2016), L.G. Polyakova (Polyakova, 2016), M.V. Bratolyubova (Bratolyubova, Trut, 2017; Bratolyubova, 2017), V.A. Parkhomenko (Parkhomenko, 2018), D.V. Levintsev (Livintsev, 2019a), M.N. Kirilov (Kirilov, 2019), V.S. Various aspects of the Nazi propaganda theme during the World War II (1939–1945) are presented in the works of E.F. Krinko (Krinko, 2014), A.M. Mamadaliev (Mamadaliev, 2015; Mamadaliev, 2015a; Mamadaliev, 2016), S.I. Degtyarev (Degtyarev, 2015), A.A. Cherkasov (Cherkasov, Smigel, 2015), Annika Valteau (Valteau, Cherkasov, 2015), V.A. Nesterenko (Nesterenko, 2015; Nesterenko, 2016; Nesterenko, 2020), S. Bogdanova (Bogdanov, Ostapuk, 2016), T.A. Magsumov (Magsumov, 2016), N.A. Garazha (Garazha, 2018), I. Shiukashvili (Shiukashvili, 2018), O. Kirichenko (Kirichenko, 2019) and K.V. Taran (Taran, 2021).

The topic of preserving military secrets and protecting classified information is discussed in the works of A.M. Mamadaliev (Mamadaliev, 2023a) and S.N. Nikitin (Nikitin, 2023). Various aspects of propaganda topics during the Cold War are presented in the works of A. Fedorov (Fedorov, 2014; Fedorov, 2017), I.G. Tazhidinova (Tazhidinova, 2017), A.E. Lebid (Lebid, 2020), O.V. Fedorova (Fedorova, 2021) and S.N. Gonta (Gonta, 2024b).

The topic of propaganda activities of foreign agents in the North-West Caucasus during the Caucasian War (1801–1864) was studied by V.B. Karataev (Karataev, 2016). The topic of propaganda during the Crimean War was studied by A.Yu. Peretyatko (Peretyatko, 2019).

The topic of mutual propaganda influence between North and South Korea was studied by Ia Shiukashvili (Shiukashvili, 2015). The themes of various aspects of propaganda during the Rhodesian War (1965–1979) was studied by S.N. Gonta (Gonta, 2024; Gonta, 2024a). The topic of propaganda during the 1994 Rwandan civil war was studied by Ia Shiukashvili (Shiukashvili, 2014).

The topic of the political and informational component of the Chechen military conflict in the 1990s was studied by V.P. Trut (Trut, 2019). The topic of representation of Western countries in films of the post-Soviet period (1992–2015) was studied by A. Fedorov (Fedorov, 2015). The topic of mutual military propaganda between Armenia and Azerbaijan during the second Karabakh war (2020) was studied by A.M. Mamadaliev (Mamadaliev, 2020a; Mamadaliev, 2021; Mamadaliev, 2021a).

Technical means of conducting propaganda were considered in the works of A.A. Romanchuk (Romanchuk, Mitiukov, 2016), V.B. Karataev (Karataev, 2017; Karataev, 2018), Yu.F. Data on the most popular topics of research published in the journal “Propaganda in the World and Local Conflicts” are presented in figures in Table 1.

5. Conclusion

Thus, based on the conducted review study, it can be concluded that during the ten-year period of publication of the journal under consideration (2014–2024), 110 articles on various areas of the history of propaganda were published in the journal.

The topics covered by the authors are quite broad and include the following areas: military propaganda during the Russian Civil War (1917–1922), military propaganda during the First World War (1914–1918), general issues of military propaganda during the Second World War (1939–1945), propaganda of Nazi Germany during the Second World War (1939–1945), history and propaganda of the Russo-Japanese War (1904–1905), propaganda during the Soviet-Finnish War (1939–1940), propaganda in Southern Rhodesia during the Bush War (1965–1979), technical means of propaganda, theoretical aspects of the history of propaganda, and others.
